Dear Sir,

The attention of the General Assembly of Europa Nostra/IBI at its meeting in Cardiff on 17 September 1993 was drawn to the threat to the integrity of the Royal Parks in the centre of Stockholm. Europa Nostra/IBI is a non-governmental organisation of 200 heritage bodies and 100 local authorities in 29 European countries, active in conserving the man-made and natural heritage.

The parks of Djurgården, Haga-Brunnsviken and Ulriksdal in the capital city of Stockholm were established on Royal initiative between the 16th and the 18th centuries, and correspond to a need for recreational areas in close proximity to the centre of population.

Djurgården, dating from the 16th and 17th century, is an example of the hunting parks that were common in Europe during this period. A great value in the case of Djurgården is that a substantial part of the original hunting park structure still exists.

Located around the lake of Brunnsviken is a unique formation of different landscape gardens created in the late 18th century. One of them, the Royal Park of Haga, is considered to be an outstanding example of the English landscape garden. It is a cultural monument of international importance. A proposed hotel development on the edge of this park if badly situated would spoil the present clear views out from the park.

At Ulriksdal the Palace Park has a basic plan of a baroque park, having been formed during the first half of the 17th century.

Europa Nostra, as now constituted,

Each of these park elements represent great values per se, and in the combination the are a unique document of European park history, representing cultural values of international importance.

Of great interest from an European perspective are also the other forms of art that are expressed in, or were established in Haga-Brunnsviken and Ulriksdal during the culturally important Gustavian period, which involved artists from other European countries.

Europa Nostra/IBI wish to stress the importance of this complex of parks as part of the wider European cultural heritage and the need for their due protection, and urges the government to take more positive steps for their protection.
